

## User Profile Analysis at 31 December 2006

We manage two separate Funds: the Extension Fund continues to support the clients of the original Independent Living Fund which closed on 31 March 1993; the 1993 Fund receives new applications since 1 April 1993. The combined number of Users of both Funds at 31 December 2006 was 19,046 and this caseload is analysed in the tables below. At that date the 1993 Fund had 1,233 applications in progress, plus 1,001 offers of financial assistance awaiting take-up.

There is a combined administration managing the two Funds, but separate figures for each Fund are maintained for policy application and accounting purposes.

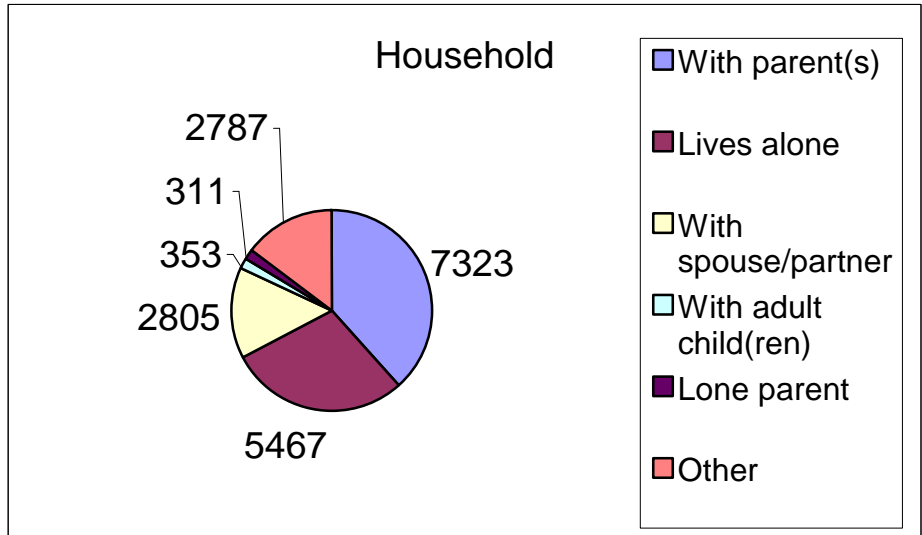
